Why Use Tools?

- Visually interesting and interactive
- Flourish mobile device compatibility
- Students need to consider how to best show data and information returning to <u>Code of Ethics</u>
- Students need to focus on audience, specifically local audience
- Students take the experiences creating these graphics/stories back to their reading of the news
- Students should consider readability/accessibility, taking the experience back to their own reading of the news

Flourish

• Pros:

- Google Sheets integration
- Easy to publish once done
- LOTS of options, many are free
- Can upload data or enter it right in Flourish
- Canva-friendly
- Can embed on websites
- Cons:
 - Templates may take time to learn
 - Hard to narrow down options
 - Some templates require a premium account
 - Can't collaborate on multiple accounts without premium

Not Teaching Journalism? Other Ways to Use These Tools

- Highlight changes of data overtime
- Timelines of events overtime
- Mathematical analysis of news events
- Retelling of news events, requiring an analysis of data
- Give students a practice data set to practice storytelling
