From Neiman Lab: "Headline A/B testing lets a newsroom try out different versions of a story's headline, to see which draws in more readers. When they come to a site's homepage, some readers might see one headline (e.g., "Here's how to boost your site's traffic"), while others see an alternative version ("e.g., 15 ways to get more clicks"). An automated system tracks the click through rate of each version and eventually declares a winner of the attention contest."
